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Parevils \& Praderers:
This book was intended as a learingaid to students studying Latin from the Latin For Children: Primer B textbook. It follows that text-book chapter for chapter. Thus, the vocabulary words learned on chapter seven of the text-book correlate to those in chapter seven of this activity book.

Not all puzzles will appeal to all students. Feel free to have students jump around or even skip puzzles. Our goal is not to stump the students with "impossible" puzzles, rather, with a reasonable sense of challenge, have students continue practicing their Latin in a setting that is fun, playful and full of games.


Use highlighters for the word search puzzles. This should help minimize the muddle of circles.
Use colored pencils on the matching games to delineate one line from another.
Encourage students to work together (when available) on the more challenging puzzles.
Have students create their own puzzles and games to share with others!
