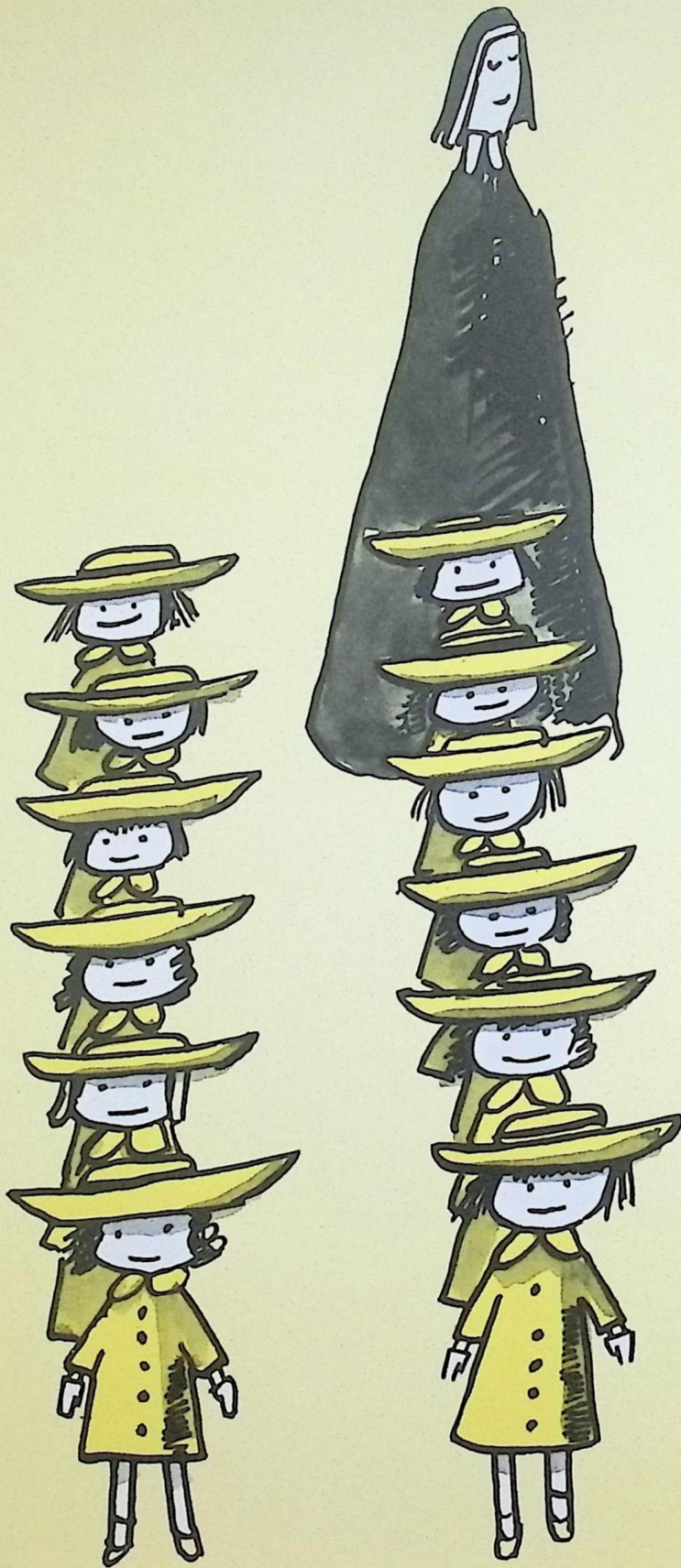

that was covered with vines





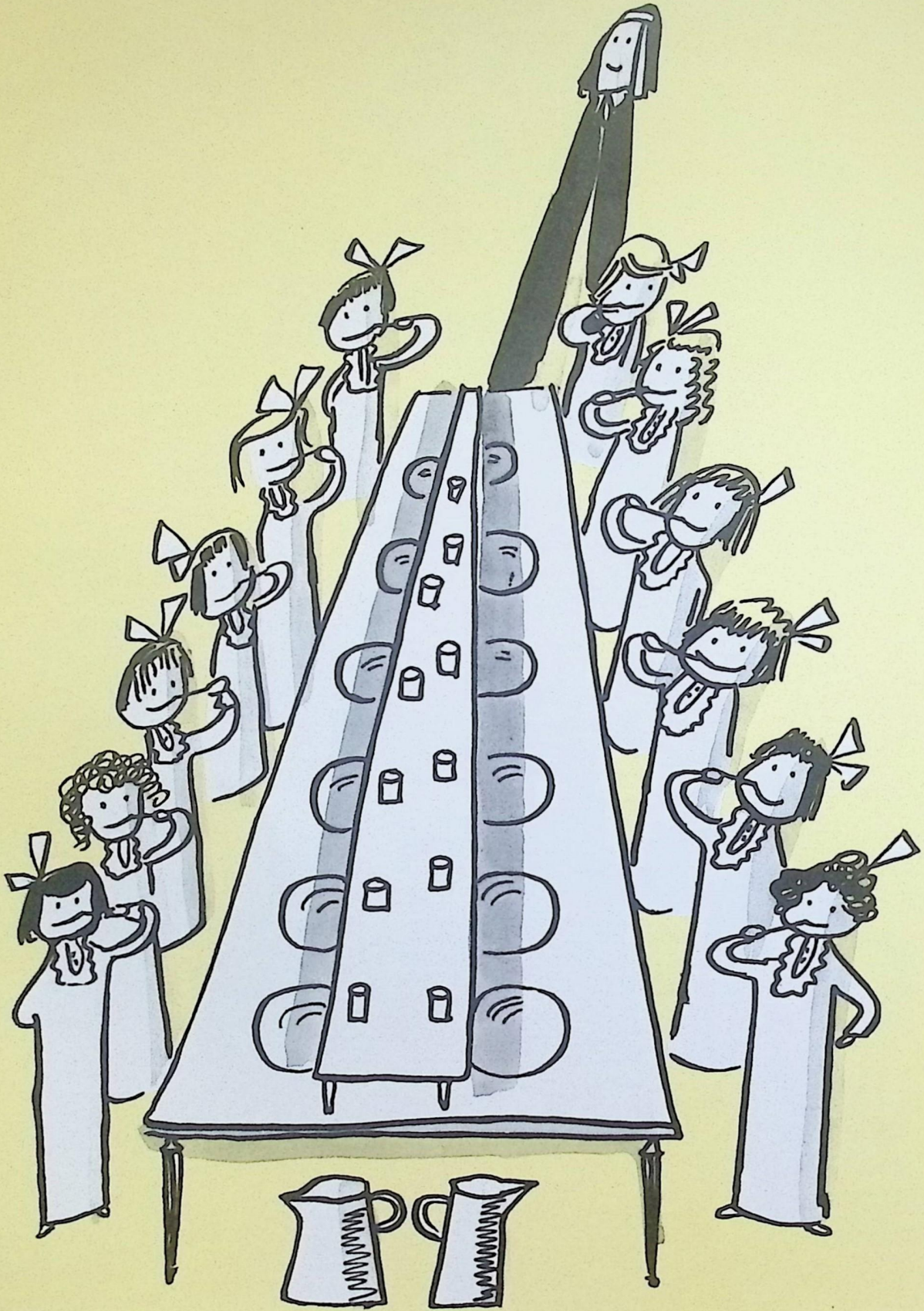
lived twelve little girls in two straight lines.





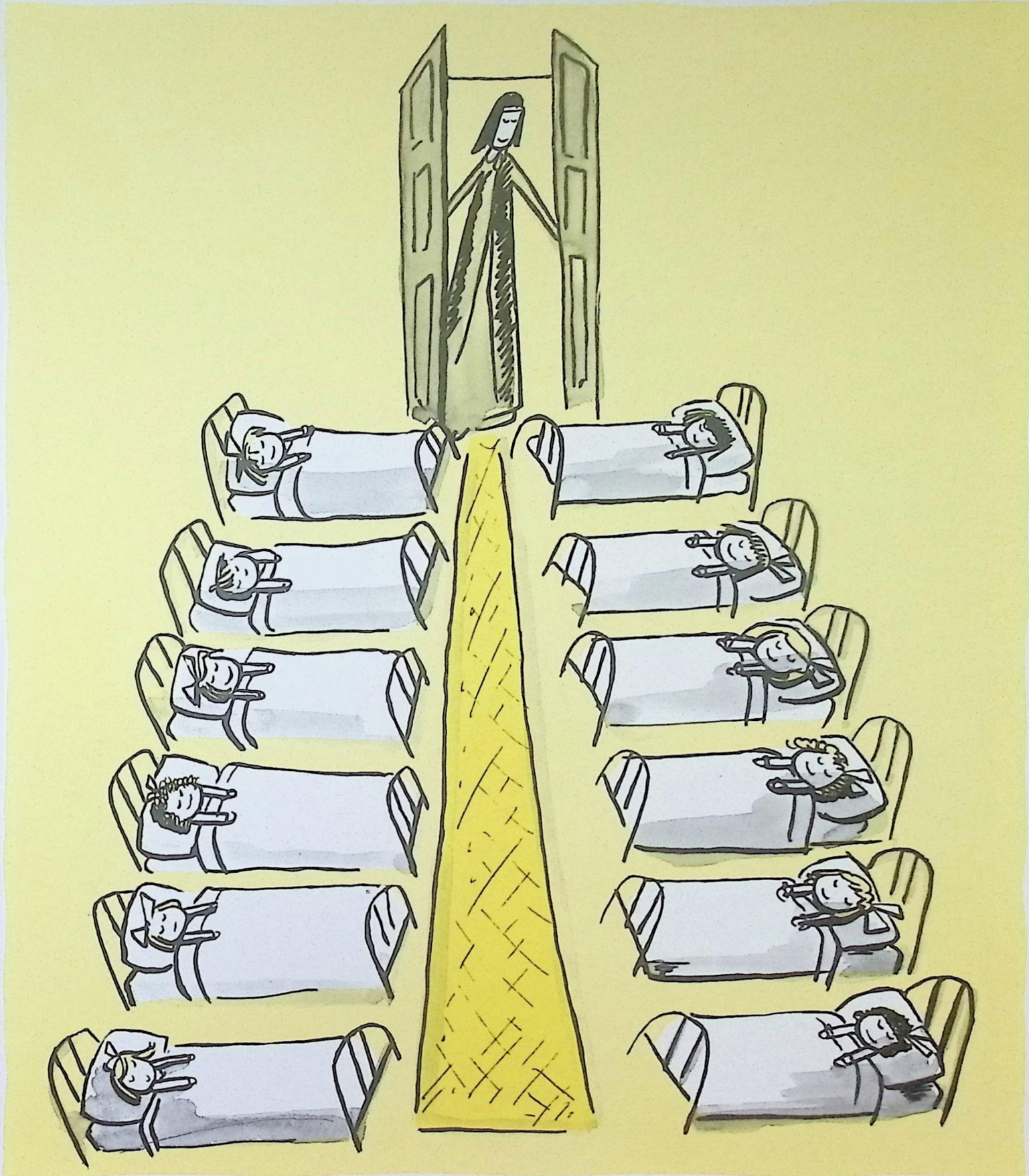
In two straight lines they broke their bread





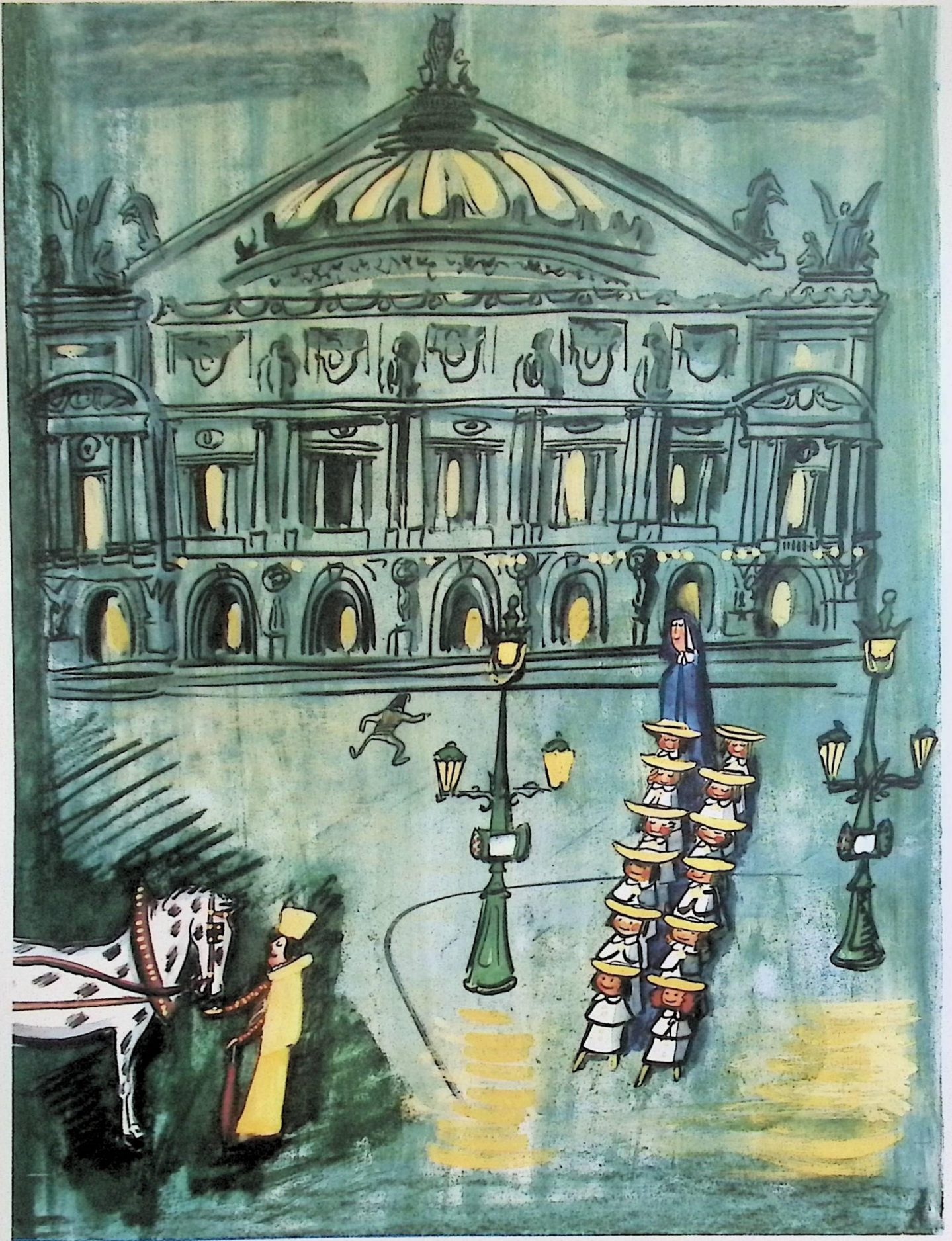
